Snapshot of September and October

In the month of September:

- 599 individuals came to the Mission Centre for food and hygiene
- 126 were children under 12 while 48 were teenagers
- 14459 lbs of food was given out

In the month of October:

- Over 17000 lbs of food given out
- As of October 29, 576 people visited the Mission Centre for food and hygiene
